CareNet of North Carolina, Inc. is seeking a full-time, regional director for its Fayetteville regional counseling center. The center opened in 1974, and operates under the name Fayetteville Family Life Center.

CareNet is a department of the Division of Faith and Health Ministries of Wake Forest Baptist Health and is the largest faith-integrated outpatient mental health network in the US.

In addition to the full time director's position, the center has a multidisciplinary staff of counselors. Center funding includes clinical income plus denominational and local board subsidies. The center will be expected to develop satellite or congregational offices in other communities throughout its primary service area.

One of the most diverse cities in the US, Fayetteville has many awards to its credit and activities for citizens. Fayetteville has won three All-America City awards. There are numerous historic sites, seven museums, three colleges and universities, multiple entertainment venues, a historic downtown and award-winning golf courses. The county seat of Cumberland County, located next door to Fort Bragg and Pope Army Airfield, Fayetteville has a large military population.

According to the 2010 Census, the city of Fayetteville has a population of 200,564. It currently ranks as the sixth-largest municipality in North Carolina. Fayetteville is located in the Sandhills in the western part of the Coastal Plain region, on the Cape Fear River. With a population of 366,363, the Fayetteville Metropolitan area is the largest in southeastern North Carolina, and the fifth-largest in the state.
